1. PROGRAM OBJECTIVES (POs)

1.1. General objectives

The Bachelor's degree program in Chinese Language aims to equip students with comprehensive knowledge, vocational skills, political qualities, ethics, professionalism, and good health, enabling them to work effectively in fields that require Chinese, and to meet the demands of society and the economy in the context of international integration.

Graduates are required to achieve Level 5 of the Vietnamese Six-Level Foreign Language Proficiency Framework, or Level 5 of the HSK proficiency test (the Chinese language proficiency assessment system used in Mainland China), or other internationally recognized equivalent standards applicable to the Chinese Language field of study.

In addition, graduates must attain Level 3 proficiency in English as a second foreign language (according to the regulations of the Ministry of Education and Training), having completed formal training at accredited institutions within the national education system.

1.2. Specific objectives (labelled POs)

Graduates of the Chinese Language field of study are expected to demonstrate the following competencies:

- Regarding knowledge

+ **PO1**: Possess knowledge of the Philosophy of Marx – Lenin, Ho Chi Minh's Ideology, and general foundational knowledge that serves as the basis for developing the political qualities for Chinese Language graduates.

+ **PO2:** Thoroughly grasps basic and up-to-date knowledge about China (geography, history, culture, society, economy, politics, etc.) and its people.

+ **PO3:** Have a firm knowledge of the fundamentals of the Chinese language (its writing system, phonetics, vocabulary, grammar, translation theory, etc.)

+ **PO4:** Be equipped with basic knowledge of learning methods and academic research at the university level, providing a foundation for pursuing further studies in postgraduate programs.

+ **PO5:** Demonstrate solid knowledge of the Chinese language and attain a proficiency level equivalent to HSK Level 5 or higher, enabling graduates to perform tasks such as translating and interpreting Chinese – Vietnamese bilingual texts, guiding Chinese-speaking tours, pursuing higher education, studying other professional fields using Chinese, or undertaking other Chinese-related professional activities within the scope of their professional competence.

- Regarding skills

+ **PO6:** Demonstrate skills in communication, teamwork, leadership, problem identification and problem-solving, critical thinking, and creativity.

+ **PO7:** Be able to use a second foreign language (a foreign language different from the field of study) and information technology in accordance with or exceeding the required learning outcomes.

+ **PO8:** Show proficiency in Chinese through the integrated skills of listening, speaking, reading, writing and translation, and have the necessary vocational skills to perform tasks related to translation, interpretation, tourism services, office administration, or business transactions.

- Regarding learner autonomy and responsibility

+ **PO9:** Be capable of managing time and personal resources effectively; demonstrate flexibility and adaptability to complex real-life changes; be able to evaluate work performance, complete tasks on time, set goals, pursue self-development, and continuously improve professional competence.

+ **PO10:** Demonstrate civic responsibility and responsibility toward oneself, society, and the environment, while maintaining sound political qualities.

+ **PO11:** Show professional dedication, honesty, and adherence to professional ethics.

+ **PO12:** Respect the linguistic and cultural diversity of China while maintaining and promoting the identity and values of Vietnamese culture.

2. EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES AND FURTHER STUDY PROSPECTS

Graduates of the Chinese Language program may pursue the following career opportunities:

- Work in government agencies or enterprises related to fields such as foreign affairs, communications, economics, trade, and tourism.
- Work in representative offices of international organizations, or in companies where Chinese is the official working language, or in organizations that maintain regular relations with Chinese-speaking countries and regions such as China, Taiwan, Hong Kong, Macau, and Singapore, among others.
- Work in governmental management bodies related to foreign affairs, as well as in foreign companies or joint-venture enterprises where Chinese is frequently used as a working language.
- Teach Chinese at universities, colleges, professional secondary schools, upper secondary schools, or lower secondary schools where Chinese is part of the curriculum.
- Conduct scientific research at research institutes where Chinese language studies constitute a major area of research.

3. LEARNING OUTCOMES

The program is designed to ensure that graduates achieve the following learning outcomes:

3.1. Knowledge

- 1) PLO1:** Apply fundamental knowledge of the Philosophy of Marx – Lenin, Political Economy of Marx – Lenin, History of the Communist Party of Vietnam, Ho Chi Minh’s Ideology, Fundamentals of law, Physical Education, National Defense and Security Education, Natural Sciences and Humanities as a foundation for acquiring specialized knowledge and developing logical and scientific thinking.
- 2) PLO2:** Have basic knowledge of relevant social sciences and humanities as well as supporting knowledge to facilitate the acquisition of foundational and specialized disciplinary knowledge and to pursue further studies at higher levels.
- 3) PLO3:** Apply Chinese language knowledge equivalent to HSK Level 5 or higher.
- 4) PLO4:** Achieve Level 3 English proficiency according to the Six-Level Foreign Language Proficiency Framework for non-native speakers (equivalent to B1 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages – CEFR) or an equivalent international certificate, and attain basic applied information technology competence with certification issued by Quy Nhon University.
- 5) PLO5:** Be able to analyze the phonological system, the structure of Chinese characters, vocabulary structures, and sentence structures in Chinese; understand linguistic concepts and the

nature of language as well as relevant linguistic issues in order to identify and analyze linguistic units and components for the study of the Chinese language.

6) PLO6: Accumulate fundamental knowledge about China, its culture and people; compare and distinguish similarities and differences between Chinese and Vietnamese cultures.

7) PLO7: Synthesize, apply, and further develop specialized and supporting knowledge for professional orientations in fields such as translation, interpretation, tourism services, office administration, and business communication.

3.2. Skills

8) PLO8: Establish objectives for individual and team activities within assigned responsibilities; demonstrate effective communication in Chinese in both social contexts and professional settings.

9) PLO9: Apply knowledge of Vietnamese and Chinese socio-cultural contexts to strengthen national cultural identity when engaging with Chinese culture, other foreign cultures, and in the process of international integration.

10) PLO10: Effectively apply the skills of listening, speaking, reading, writing, and translating Chinese in social communication, workplace communication, and professional tasks related to the field of study.

11) PLO11: Perform effectively in roles such as coordinator, project assistant, office staff member, and similar positions using Chinese in administrative agencies, social organizations, professional organizations, enterprises, translation centers, notary offices, consulting offices, or service–tourism enterprises and educational organizations.

12) PLO12: Demonstrate initiative, confidence, creativity, and the ability to work independently or collaboratively; organize effective self-study and research activities and develop lifelong learning capacity to enhance professional competence.
