1. OBJECTIVES

1.1. General Objectives

The objective of the Law training program is to train students to have political qualities, ethics, health, comprehensive and systematic legal professional knowledge, a solid grasp of social principles and laws related to law, basic legal practice skills, the ability to work independently, creatively, and solve problems in the field of Law, adapt to the working environment, and possess a sense of public service.

1.2. Specific Objectives

- PO1: Possess comprehensive and systematic legal professional knowledge, a solid grasp of social principles and laws related to law.

- PO2: Possess basic legal practice skills.
- PO3: Have the ability to work independently, creatively, and solve problems in the field of Law, adapt to the working environment.
- PO4: Possess political qualities, ethics, health, and a sense of public service.

2. JOB OPPORTUNITIES AND PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

After graduating from the Law undergraduate training program, learners can work at:

- Central and local state agencies such as: central ministries and sectors, people's councils and people's committees at all levels, specialized agencies under provincial people's committees, judicial agencies such as people's courts, people's procuracies, and civil judgment enforcement agencies.
- Political, socio-political, and socio-professional organizations such as: Party agencies and socio-political organizations; intergovernmental and non-governmental international organizations in other countries and especially in Vietnam.
- Legal consulting and service organizations: law offices, law firms, notary public offices, commercial arbitration and mediation centers.
- Enterprises.
- Education, training, and research institutions: teaching at education and training institutions, researching in the field of policy and law.
- Self-employment after obtaining a practice certificate: lawyer, notary public, establishing and managing a business.

Further Study:

After graduation, learners can continue to pursue postgraduate training programs to enhance their professional qualifications, such as Master's and PhD degrees in Law or advanced degrees in related fields such as Master's and PhD degrees in Public Administration, Economic Management, and Political Science.

5. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Learners applying to undergraduate Law programs must meet the following requirements:

- Have graduated from high school or equivalent;
- The minimum total admission score must reach 60% of the maximum score on the assessment scale.

Training institutions specify admission standards based on examinations, selection, and other assessment methods, or specific requirements for knowledge, capacity, qualities, and experience for learners of each training program, but must ensure that knowledge of

Mathematics and Literature, or Mathematics, or Literature is assessed and reaches at least 60% of the maximum score on the assessment scale.

Applicants for all modes of undergraduate Law training must meet the above conditions, except for applicants who already possess an undergraduate degree, who are exempt from these requirements.

6. MODE OF TRAINING, GRADUATION CONDITIONS

6.1. Mode of Training: Credit-based system

6.2. Graduation Conditions: (specialization, prerequisite courses, foreign language, informatics standards)

- Specialization: Accumulate sufficient courses and volume of the Training Program, with a cumulative GPA of 2.00 or higher for the entire course.
- Physical Education, National Defense and Security Education: Complete all Physical Education modules and possess a National Defense and Security Education certificate.
- Meet the foreign language and IT proficiency standards prescribed by the University.

7. TEACHING METHODS AND LEARNING OUTCOME ASSESSMENT

7.1. Teaching Methods

- The teaching methods used in the Law training program comprise various teaching and learning activities to help learners not only acquire fundamental professional and social knowledge but also the ability to apply this knowledge to collaborate with others, thereby developing personal skills such as communication, negotiation, and teamwork. The methods used in teaching-learning are very diverse, such as Lecture Method; Discussion Method; Debate Method; Case Method; Role-playing Method (mock trial, mediation, negotiation...); Teamwork Method; Field Experience Method; and other methods appropriate for the training program. Specifically:
- *Direct Instruction:*

Direct instruction is a teaching method where information is conveyed directly to the learner, with the lecturer presenting and students listening. This teaching method is often applied in traditional classrooms and is effective when the lecturer wants to convey basic

information or explain a new skill. The teaching methods applied include: Lecture and Guest Lecture.

- *Indirect Instruction:*

Indirect instruction is a teaching method where learners are facilitated in the learning process without any explicit teaching activity being performed by the lecturer. This is a learner-centered approach to teaching, where the lecturer does not directly transmit the lesson content to the learner. Instead, learners are encouraged to participate actively in the learning process, using critical thinking skills to solve problems. The teaching methods applied include: Case-Based Learning, Problem-Based Learning, and Inquiry.

- *Experiential Learning:*

Experiential learning is a teaching method where learners acquire knowledge and skills through what they experience via practice, actual observation, and feeling. They learn by doing and experiencing. The teaching methods applied include: Experiential Learning, Internship, Field Trip, Simulation, and Practice.

- *Interactive Instruction:*

Interactive instruction is a teaching method where learners combine multiple activities in the classroom such as posing a problem or open-ended question and asking learners to discuss and debate to solve that problem. The teacher's role is to guide the learners step-by-step to solve the problem, thereby helping them achieve the teaching objectives. Learners can learn from peers or the teacher to develop social skills, critical thinking, communication, and negotiation for decision-making. The teaching methods applied include: Interactive Lecture, e-Learning, and Group Exercise.

- *Self-Study:*

Self-study is understood as all learning activities performed by individual learners with very little or no guidance from the teacher. This is a process that helps learners self-direct their learning according to their own learning experience, having autonomy and control over their learning activities through exercises, projects, or problems suggested and guided by the teacher in class. The learning methods under this strategy mainly include: Work Assignment and Self-Directed Learning.
